The last week of September saw 14 men come together from all over England and be joined by two Germans and travel to Tauernhof, Schladming, for the SportsReach Classics tour. What followed was an amazing week of fellowship, as from day one, men opened up and shared powerful testimonies, which encouraged the team and also challenged us all to go deeper in our walks with God. As we all shared in the first meeting, brief testimonies, prayer and communion, the time just flew by and as one said afterwards - "that was the shortest 4 hour meeting I have ever been in!" As men shared their journeys through life one thing became apparent - 'For this I have Jesus!' His presence and faithfulness was the underlying truth in every person's story. We cried together, prayed together, laughed together and played football together as we sought to glorify Him in all that we did. It was a real joy to play football with the team (average age 51.9 years!) over the week and to use the times after the games to share the good news about Jesus. After one game, two men indicated that God had really spoken to them and they wanted to know Him and be forgiven! We pray that they may continue to grow closer to Him day by day. Another game gave us the opportunity to share openly with a team of 14 Afghanistan refugees. They listened attentively and were very keen to take any literature we had. In a world full of sadness and bad news, they were open to hear the greatest news. As we returned home, with a few aches and pains having played 5 games in as many days, we rejoiced in Him and resolute to walk closer with Him day by day and to share with others - 'For this I have Jesus!'
