"Call them all together- men, women and children, and the foreigners living in your towns - so they may hear this Book of Instruction and learn to fear the Lord your God... Do this so that your children who have not known these instructions will hear them and will learn to fear the Lord your God." Deuteronomy 31v12,13.

South Africa



'How shall they hear without a preacher?'

What an amazing trip! And as always, God amazed us with the open doors He gave us for sharing the gospel!

In February, a team of 8 travelled for our return visit to South Africa, working alongside Nick and Sheila Court, **Stepwise Youth Ministry**. We flew to Johannesburg, and the following day began our ministry in Tembisa (thought to be the biggest township in the southern hemisphere) doing **street evangelism** to help with a church plant. Children soon flocked to play sport with us, and passers-by were keen to talk as we invited them to **Bible study** and to **church**.

We then spent the next 6 days in **Clarens**, doing mainly schools work, but also with the opportunity to share with the Municipal Workers. At the Combined School we had the **whole school for assemblies for 5 mornings!** We took the theme '**The Four Points**', as you can see on our t-shirts. Clarens Primary were very welcoming too — they had three teachers absent, so they gave us sports classes with most of the school! It was during the first period that I looked around and felt so blessed that God had brought the right team together — Ruth Snalam (17) Sarah and Ruth (our daughters, both 14) were orgainising netball matches and coaching for the girls, while me, Grace (16) and James Sutton (10) did football training and matches with the boys! (Will and Sooty were teaching in the high school). At the end of each hour we shared testimony and a gospel message with the children. **13 boys responded!**

A great time again at **Tschpong Feeding Programme**, acting out Bible passages, singing and sharing 'Meet the King'! I asked the children if they would like to 'meet the King' for themselves to come forwards after the meal and we would pray with them...around 30-40 children came forward over the 4 days we were there, the first girl came while I was still eating! All of our team really enjoyed our time there, just playing games with the children after the meal, we spent many memorable hours there, late into the afternoon. Happy days! Then there were the farm schools – again more sport, assemblies, classes, we had to be ready for anything!

But the **most amazing opportunity was in the high school**. We had taken a few classes there last year, and when we asked on the Monday morning which classes we could take, the principal printed off a sheet of the week's lessons, and said we could have every 'Life Orientation Class'! This amounted to 15 hours of teaching with the 16-20 year olds! What a time we had with them! Will shared with them from **John 10 v 10**, while others of us shared testimony and sang. The classes often ran over time with all the questions the students were asking! Many of the young people responded to what they heard, and **trusted Christ as Saviour** – praise God! Please pray for them that they will grow strong in the Lord, and pray that we will have more opportunities with them.

On a personal note, I felt a bit daunted when I realised we had two classes at the same time, which meant that I would be teaching one group for an hour...but God provided in a tremendous way, and at the end of the class I asked for any to raise their hands if they wanted to repent and come to Christ...about 38 of the 42 students did so! What a privilege to lead them in the sinners' prayer!

Note to self – I can't, but HE can!!!

Back to Kempton Park, more schools, more sport, youth Bible study, church services...and then back home, **tired out but rejoicing** in all the **HE** had done! Please continue to pray for this work, and for wisdom in planning our next mission to S Africa! *Sue*

The regular managers meetings have reminded me that whilst we are individual teams competing against one another, we are united in the work to share the gospel and prayer support for each other.

I would like to encourage anyone who is considering joining the league. There is no greater privilege than sharing the love of The Lord Jesus Christ. Sometimes we feel totally inadequate and unprepared, but God equips and can use the weakest if they are a willing.
